

Process for the G&CP Knowledge Platform Content Release

STEP 1 – Availability of Existing Content

Existing Information about Gender and Chemicals is identified.

STEP 2 – Content Submission

Partners and Stakeholders have left their proposal for new content by navigating to the “[Contribute/Share Material](#)” section and selecting the option to upload/share materials on the G&CP Knowledge Platform Website.

During the submission, contributors are asked to select appropriate tags or categories to support the classification and thematic alignment of the content.

STEP 3 – Approval of Content

The proposal for new content is received by the Secretariat.

The Secretariat suggests an initial categorization for the content and forwards a pre-filled *assessment template* — based on the criteria defined by the Working Group to assess the relevance, quality, and alignment of the submitted content — to the (responsible) topic expert reviewer.

Topic Expert reviewers are partners who are engaging actively in the Working Group of Gender Data and Information and have informed the Secretariat of its wish to be appointed internally.

Expert reviewers will inform the Secretariat about their assessment (result) via the *assessment template* within 4 weeks at the latest.

In case the result of the assessment is ambiguous, the Secretariat will forward the proposal to the board for a decision (approval or rejection) with a deadline of 4 weeks.

The Secretariat will upload the content on the Knowledge Platform.

Content Criteria for Curated Resources

The purpose of this document is to provide general criteria to ensure a transparent basis for the consistent selection and quality management of individual resources included in the *knowledge base* of the Gender & Chemicals Knowledge Platform.

Cross-cutting Criteria for the Knowledge Base

Beyond the criteria for individual curated resources, the variety of resources within the knowledge base should reflect diverse perspectives and account for different regional contexts, cultural relevance, and language accessibility, while considering intersectionality and including information on marginalized communities and underrepresented topics.

Criteria for Curated Resources

- **Relevance:** The resource aligns with the platform's thematic focus on gender and chemicals and is relevant to its target audience (including professionals working in chemicals management, health and environmental protection, and/or gender, as well as media representatives and civil society).
- **Source Credibility & Authority:** The resource was created by a reputable institution and/or author with proven expertise in the subject matter. Authorship is transparent, and there is no apparent conflict of interest related to the content.
- **Accuracy & Reliability:** The resource is evidence-based and reflects methodologically transparent, and scientifically sound information.
- **Timeliness:** The information is current or remains relevant, and no significant newer evidence contradicts it.
- **Alignment with Objectives & Frameworks:** The content does not contradict the objectives of the Gender & Chemicals Partnership or the international frameworks underpinning these objectives (e.g., United Nations 2030 Agenda, Beijing Declaration and Platform for Action). The content avoids reinforcing gender stereotypes.
